JSTC is an actively managed ETF that seeks to track the JUSTICE Index. The Index is designed to support progressive movements for change and includes a global universe of public companies whose practices align with social justice values.

In addition to the metrics traditionally considered for ESG investing, Adasina screens companies based on the Social Justice Investment Criteria ("Criteria") during the ETF's portfolio construction. The Criteria-applied strategy uses community-sourced impact data and sets the standards for how publicly traded companies participate in gender, racial, economic, and climate justice.

DEFINITIONS

Beta is a measure of the volatility—or systematic risk—of a security or portfolio compared to the market as a whole. Standard Deviation measures the dispersion of a dataset relative to its mean. Sharpe Ratio consists of taking the excess return of a portfolio, relative to the risk-free rate, and dividing it by the standard deviation of a portfolio's excess returns, providing a measurement of a portfolio's outperformance per unit of a portfolio's volatility. Information Ratio is a measurement of portfolio returns beyond the returns of a benchmark, usually an index, compared to the volatility of those returns. Tracking Error is the divergence between the price behavior of a position or a portfolio and the price behavior of a benchmark. The 30-Day SEC yield is calculated with a standardized formula mandated by the SEC. The formula is based on maximum offering price per share and does not reflect waivers in effect. Portfolio turnover is a measure of how frequently assets within a fund are bought and sold by the managers. Portfolio turnover is calculated by taking either the total amount of new securities purchased, or the number of securities sold (whichever is less) over a particular period, divided by the total net asset value (NAV) of the fund. The price-to-earnings ratio (P/E ratio) is the ratio for valuing a company that measures its current share price relative to its per-share earnings. The price-to-book ratio (P/B ratio) is used to compare a firm's market capitalization to its book value. It's calculated by dividing the company's stock price per share by its book value per share (BVPS).

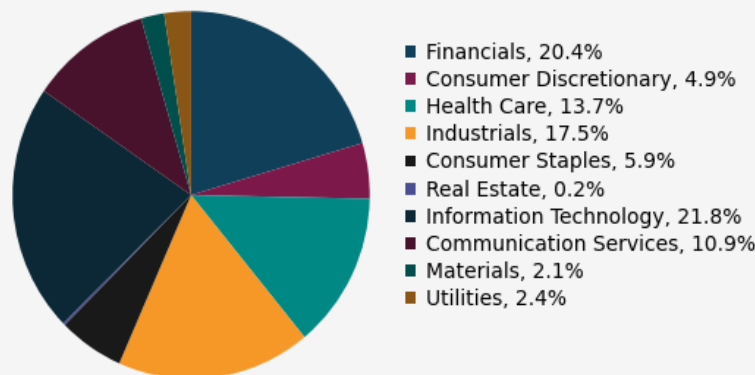

Economic Justice: To create a fair, sustainable, and equitable financial future for all people and communities. We educate investors on the risks posed by economic injustice in the public markets and mobilize investors to discourage companies from participating in economically unjust systems.

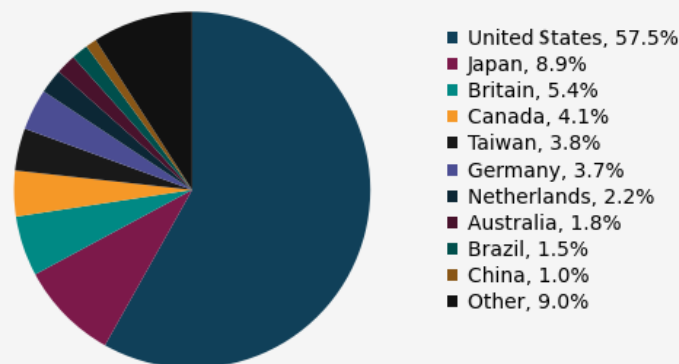
